## 2. Hazards Identification

**Emergency overview** Prolonged exposure may cause chronic effects. CONTENTS UNDER PRESSURE. Aerosol. Pressurized container may explode when exposed to heat or flame.

## 4. First Aid Measures

**First aid procedures**

**Eye contact** Flush eyes with water as a precaution. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Get medical attention if irritation develops or persists.

**Skin contact** Immediately take off all contaminated clothing. Wash off with soap and water. Get medical attention if irritation develops or persists.

**Inhalation** Call a physician if symptoms develop or persist.

**Ingestion** Rinse mouth. Do not induce vomiting without medical advice. If vomiting occurs naturally, have victim lean forward to reduce risk of aspiration. If ingestion of a large amount does occur, seek medical attention.

## 5. Fire Fighting Measures

**Flammable properties** Containers may explode when heated. Vapor or gas may spread to distant ignition sources and flash back. Runoff to sewer may cause fire or explosion hazard.

**Extinguishing media**

**Suitable extinguishing media** Large Fires: Water spray, fog or regular foam.  
Small Fires: Dry chemical, CO2, water spray or regular foam.

## Protection of firefighters

### Protective equipment and precautions for firefighters

In the event of fire and/or explosion do not breathe fumes. Wear full protective clothing, including helmet, self-contained positive pressure or pressure demand breathing apparatus, protective clothing and face mask. If tank, rail car or tank truck is involved in a fire, ISOLATE for 800 meters (1/2 mile) in all directions; also consider initial evacuation for 800 meters (1/2 mile) in all directions. ALWAYS stay away from tanks engulfed in flame. Fight fire from maximum distance or use unmanned hose holders or monitor nozzles. Withdraw immediately in case of rising sound from venting safety devices or any discoloration of tanks due to fire. Containers should be cooled with water to prevent vapor pressure build up. For massive fire, use unmanned hose holders or monitor nozzles; if this is impossible, withdraw from area and let fire burn.

## 6. Accidental Release Measures

### Methods for containment

Eliminate all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks, or flames in immediate area). Stop leak if you can do so without risk. Move the cylinder to a safe and open area if the leak is irreparable. Prevent entry into waterways, sewers, basements or confined areas.

### Methods for cleaning up

Small Spills: Wipe up with absorbent material (e.g. cloth, fleece). Clean contaminated surface thoroughly.

## 7. Handling and Storage

### Handling

Pressurized container: Do not pierce or burn, even after use. Do not handle or store near an open flame, heat or other sources of ignition. Do not use if spray button is missing or defective. Use only with adequate ventilation. Avoid prolonged exposure.

### Storage

Level 1 Aerosol.  
Contents under pressure. Do not puncture, incinerate or crush. The pressure in sealed containers can increase under the influence of heat. Keep away from heat, sparks, and flame. Avoid exposure to long periods of sunlight. Store in cool place. Keep container tightly closed. Keep the container dry. Keep out of the reach of children.
